# Battersea Power Station: Control Room A



The 1930s control room is a space for up to 250 guests that celebrates the history of Battersea Power Station. From the restored switchboards and control panels to the Art Deco glass ceiling, this authentic space is an unforgettable setting for events.



# About Battersea Power Station: Control Room A



Control Room A is the jewel in the crown of Battersea Power Station, a landmark on the London skyline and an important part of the city's identity.

The room was built to manage the distribution of electricity generated by the Power Station – about a fifth of all the power used by London, including Buckingham Palace. The station was decommissioned in 1975, after which point the building fell into disrepair.

The Grade II listed Art Deco space has been expertly restored by architects WilkinsonEyre, working in close partnership with Historic England.

The original control panels and machinery have been returned to their former glory. The team used a host of new restoration techniques, including digital scanning to exactly replicate the 1930s paint colours and 3D printing to produce missing knobs and buttons of the control desks.

Teak parquet floors, marble finishings and an elaborate gold-coffered glass ceiling bring Art Deco glamour at its most authentic. With a capacity of up to 250 guests, it offers a unique venue for receptions, fashion shows, dinners and launches.

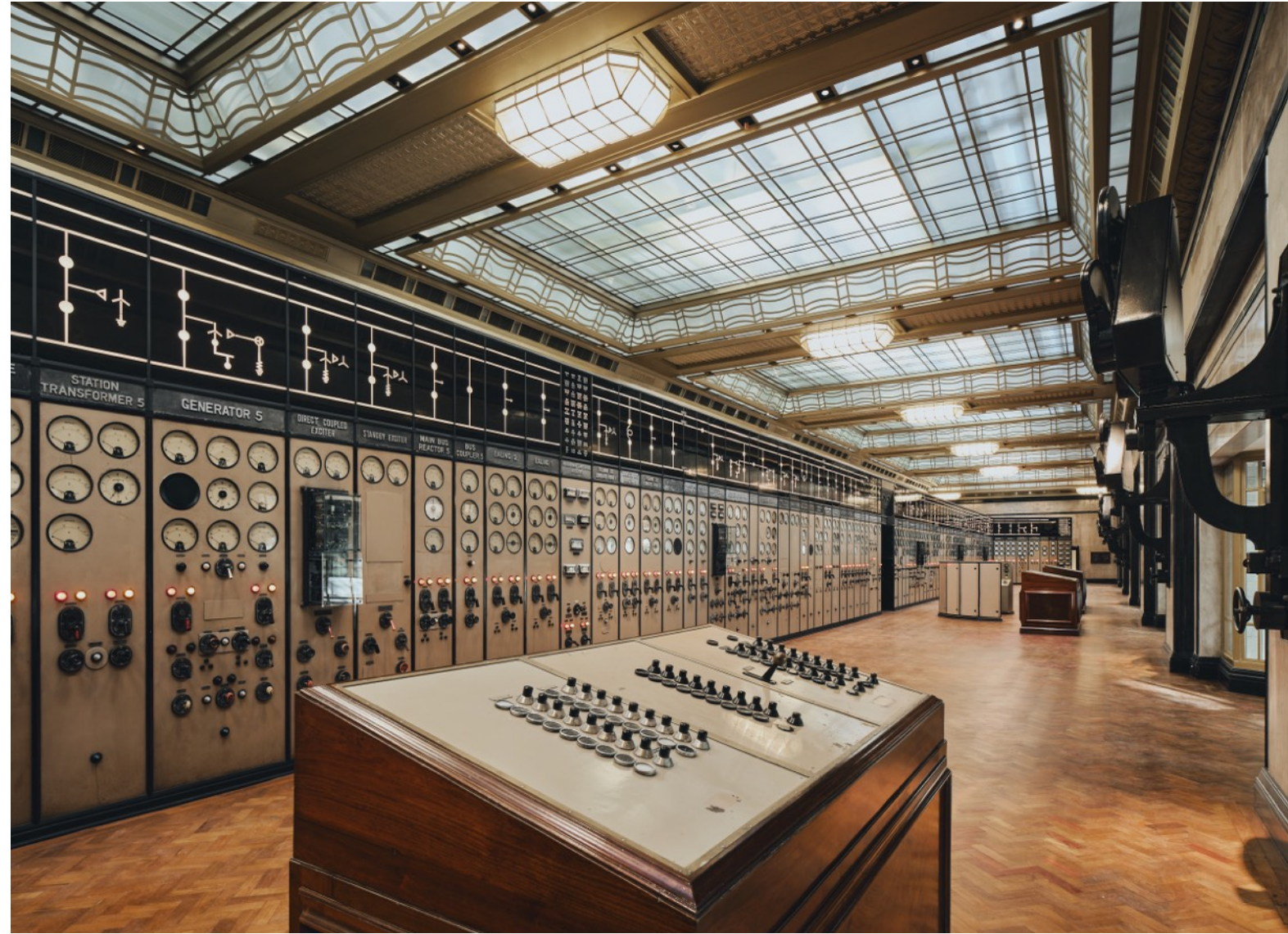

## *Spaces* The Directors' Entrance

The venue is accessed through the Directors' entrance to the south side of the building. Its impressive bronze doors are decorated with original sculptural panels depicting a personification of energy. The entrance leads to a grand Art Deco lobby, which serves as a perfect place for guest registration.







## *Spaces* Directors' Bar

From the Lobby, guests would travel to the Directors' Bar via the staircase or the original lift, before entering this light filled space featuring a large skylight and window. The Directors' Bar serves as the perfect space for reception drinks, serviced from a brandable, purpose-built bar. The room also has space for a satellite cloakroom and could be used as a catering breakout area between conference sessions, or as an exhibition stand area.





## *Spaces* Control Room A

Control Room A is the main event space, serving 250 guests for a standing reception and up to 100 guests seated for dinner. With beautifully restored control panels in situ, a gold-coffered glass ceiling and original Art Deco finishings, it is a unique and highly memorable space. The perfect setting for celebrations and events including receptions, fashion shows and brand launches calling for a distinctive setting.

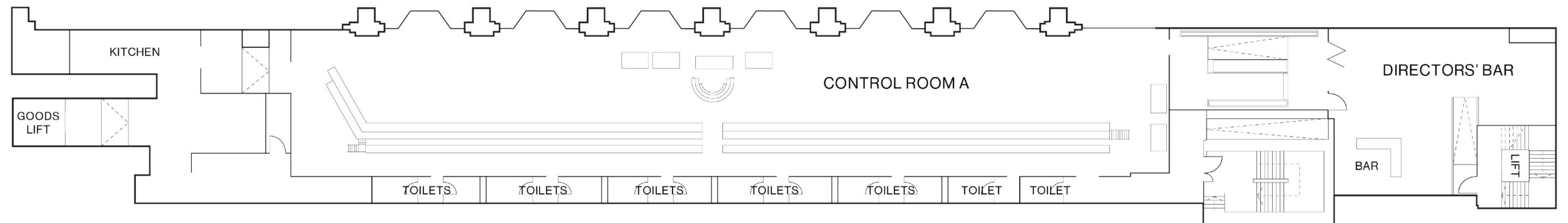

## *Neighbourhood*

Battersea Power Station is one of London's most recognisable buildings. Built between 1929 and 1935, it sits on the south bank of the River Thames as a legacy to the city's industrial past.

The Power Station lay in disrepair after it was decommissioned in the 1970s. The current redevelopment project involved conservation and restoration of the building's Art Deco. The revival of the site has drawn Apple Inc to make it the home of their London Campus.

The Power Station is the heart of the 42-acre development, which provides an innovative place to shop, eat, drink, live, work and play with over 100 shops, restaurants, leisure attractions (including Lift 109) and hundreds of homes for the city's workers. The Grade II listed building encompasses London's most exciting shopping and leisure destination south of the river.
